JACK: URBAN FLOODING IS A RECURRING PROBLEM HERE IN THE OCEAN STATE.

RESIDENTS ARE LOSING THEIR HOMES AND BUSINESS. EFFORTS ARE BEING

MADE BUT WILL THEY BE ENOUGH?

JACK: THE LOW COASTAL AREAS OF RHODE ISLAND ARE FLOODING. FOR MANY

YEARS THIS FLOODING HAS BEEN AFFECTING RESIDENTS BORDERING THE

COAST. ONE OF THE ISSUES RESIDENTS FACE IS POOR DRIVING CONDITIONS.

JACK: AT INDIA POINT PARK, PROVIDENCE RESIDENT, AYA ROTHWELL,

EXPLAINS TO US THEIR EXPERIENCE WITH URBAN FLOODING IN THE CITY.

AYA ROTHWELL: THIS SUMMER I MOVED TO PROVIDENCE WHICH HAS WAY

MORE CONCRETE ROADS AND THERE IS NOT AS MUCH WATER GOING INTO THE

SOIL IMMEDIATELY COMPARED TO SOUTH KINGSTOWN WHERE I LIVED AND SO I

WAS TRYING TO DRIVE THROUGH TO JUST GET OUT OF MY APARTMENT

SOMEWHERE. I WAS DRIVING THROUGH THIS HUGE PUDDLE AND I WAS LIKE, "IS MY CAR GOING TO BE OK?".

JACK: URBAN FLOODING IS AN ISSUE THAT IS CAUSED FROM MORE THAN JUST RAIN AND SEA LEVEL RISE. WATER THAT RESIDES IN THE GAPS OF SOIL CAN CREATE FLOODING FROM WITHIN THE GROUND. PHD CANDIDATE MAMOON ISMAIL EXPLAINS THIS ISSUE.

MAMOON: PART OF THE PARTICIPATION WE RECEIVE GOES INTO THE GROUNDWATER IN TERMS OF FREE CHARGE. IT INFILTRATES IT THROUGH THE SOIL AND THEN EVENTUALLY REACHES THE WATER TABLE AND THAT CAUSES THE WATER TABLE TO RISE.

JACK: AT THE UNIVERSITY OF RHODE ISLAND A COLLEAGUE OF ISMAIL USES A MODEL TO DEMONSTRATE HOW FLOODING AFFECTS URBAN AREAS.

JACK: IF THE WATER TABLE RISES WITHOUT AN EXTRACTION FROM THE AQUIFER, THIS IS WHEN FLOODING CAN TAKE PLACE.

JACK: ENGINEER DARRELL MOORE EXPLAINS THIS PROCESS.

DARRELL MOORE: AQUIFERS ARE AT CAPACITY, SO WHAT HAPPENS WHEN WE GET A 5 TO 6 INCH RAINSTORM THAT COMES THROUGH. THERE'S NO WAY FOR THAT TO GO BACK INTO THE GROUND, SO THE ONLY PLACE THAT IT CAN GO, ON TOP OF WHAT'S THERE, AND THEN IT FOLLOWS GRAVITY AND FINDS ITS WAY TO THE NEAREST WATERWAY AND OUT TO THE OCEAN.

JACK: IN ORDER TO ENACT CHANGE, HE DEEMS THIS NECESSARY

DARELL MOORE: COOPERATION BETWEEN FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, STATE GOVERNMENT, AND THE TOWNS.

JACK: WORKING IN THE FIELD, MOORE SEES THE REALITY OF THIS PROBLEM.

DARRELL MOORE: ANYBODY THAT GETS FLOODED, ANYBODY THAT CUTS CUT OFF FROM EMERGENCY SERVICES. THEIR EMOTIONAL FEELING IN THAT MOMENT IS "THIS IS BAD".

**JACK: ANOTHER PROVIDENCE RESIDENT, GEORGE SITAMAL, SPEAKS ON THE
EFFECTS OF URBAN FLOODING.**

**GEORGE SITAMAL: FLOODING HERE IN RHODE ISLAND ... IT DOES HAPPEN AND
WHEN IT DOES IT USUALLY IS PRETTY BAD FOR TRAFFIC. OLNEY-VILLE ALWAYS
GETS FLOODED EVERY SINGLE TIME THERE IS RAIN I DON'T UNDERSTAND WHY.**

**JACK: URBAN FLOODING IS IMPACTING THE LIVES OF MANY HERE IN RHODE
ISLAND. TAKING STEPS LIKE DRAINING WATER FROM AQUIFERS AND
IMPLEMENTING NEW ZONING AREAS MAY BE HOW WE DEAL WITH THIS IN THE
NEAR FUTURE.**
